Comments from Citizens

April Smith and Tracy Berry

Ms. Smith and Ms. Berry are with the Randolph County Animal Shelter. They tell the Commission the Randolph County Animal Shelter is a private, non-profit organization. It is funded through donations, tobacco tax, county commission, and the city of Roanoke. They carry their own insurance, pay their own taxes, and own their own building. They are monitored by the State.

Comments from Officials

Adam Downs - Coroner

Mr. Downs informs the Commission of the Expanded Infrastructure support for coroner, medical examiner, and medicolegal death investigator grant he has received from the NNPHI. The amount he is awarded is \$7,000.00 to go towards the purchases of field software, I-pads, camera, and a computer.

Mike Copeland - Cleburne County Water Authority

Informs the Commission the CDBG grant will close out at the end of March and asks for authorization for the Water Department to reapply for the grant in April or if the Commission is wanting to use it for something else. A decision needs to be made before the next Commission meeting. After a brief discussion, the Commission informs Mr. Copeland to gather up all the information and present it at the next work session. This will give him time to reapply before the application deadline. Mr. Copeland also informs the Commission that the advertisement, for bids on ARPA projects, was published in newspapers today. The bid opening will be held at 11:00AM on Wednesday, March 15th at the Water Department office.

Resolution #5304-4

Whereas, a form from Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control ("ABC") Board has been submitted to the County for the Commission to confirm whether there have been any changes to the County alcohol license fees;

Whereas, the fees currently in place are set at the maximum amount that Counties are allowed to charge;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission resolves to continue to charge the same alcohol license fees and report same to the ABC Board.

Resolution #5304-5

Whereas, regular preventative maintenance of County vehicles can be provided by the Engineer's Department;

Whereas, the service provided will be a cost savings to the various departments of the County;

Whereas, the Sheriff has requested that only certified mechanics be allowed to perform maintenance on Sheriff Department vehicles;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission is directing all Department Heads, other than the Sheriff, to use the Engineer's Department for regular vehicle preventative maintenance.

Resolution #5304-6

Whereas, the Cleburne County Engineer is responsible for regular vehicle maintenance for most of the County Departments;

Whereas, there are times that some of the vehicles need repairs beyond maintenance alone;

Whereas, the Engineer's Department is requesting to advertise a Request for Proposals dealing with repairs, other than regular maintenance, of fleet vehicles for the County;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission directs the Engineering Department request bids for the fleet repairs.

Resolution #5304-7

Whereas, the Cleburne County Engineer is requesting to bid out motorgrading of dirt roads in the County;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission agrees that the motor grading be bid out and directs the Engineer to solicit same.

Resolution #5304-8

Whereas, the Cleburne County Sheriff's Department requests the Cleburne County Commission to authorize surplus of vehicles that are no longer useful as follows:

2008 Chevrolet Tahoe VIN: 1GNEC03018R257093 (Bad motor, missing body parts)

2014 Ford Explorer VIN: 1FM5K8AR2EGA65342 (Bad transmission, missing body parts)

Resolution #5304-9

Whereas, the Cleburne County Sheriff's Department has successfully hired 3 School Resource Officers (SRO)s;

Whereas, one of the new SROs is already a certified SRO, but needs Continuing Education, and the other 2 need the SRO Certification;

Whereas, attendance at the National School Resource Officer training in June 2023, will achieve the training needed;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission directs that the officers attend this training and consents to amend the budget to pay for same.

Resolution #5304-10

RESOLUTION FOR THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS FROM THE COUNTY'S AWARD OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT LOCAL AND TRIBAL CONSISTENCY FUND FOR EUIPMENT TO FACILITATE THE DELIVERY OF GOVERNMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, Cleburne County, Alabama, (the "County") has received an award from the American Rescue Plan Act Local and Tribal Consistency Funds ("LATCF funds"; and

WHEREAS, Cleburne County Commission (the "Commission") is charged with ensuring that the County's LATCF funds are expended in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, the County may expend LATCF funds for programs, services, and capital expenditures which fulfill a governmental purpose; and

WHEREAS, the provision of law enforcement services within the County, generally, and through resource officers in the County's public schools serves a governmental purpose to provide for the health and well-being of residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that in order to effectively provide these services it is necessary to procure three (3) additional law enforcement vehicles to facilitate the hiring and equipping of three (3) additional law enforcement officers to serve as resource officers for the County's public school system; and

WHEREAS, the County has identified, through a process consistent with the state's competitive bid law, Stivers as a qualified vendor from which to purchase these law enforcement vehicles at a cost of \$38,320.00 each; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that the expenditure of LATCF funds to purchase these vehicles is a reasonable, necessary, and eligible use of these funds and has conditionally agreed to allocate LATCF funds to cover the cost of acquiring these vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION as follows:

- 1) The Commission hereby allocates \$114,960.00 of the County's LATCF funds for the purchase of the law enforcement vehicles described herein.
- 2) Notwithstanding any provision in this Resolution to the contrary, the LATCF funds allocated herein may not be used for lobbying activities, to include any direct or indirect payments for any personal service, advertisement, telegram, telephone, letter, printed or written matter, or other device intended or designed to influence in any manner a Member of Congress, a jurisdiction, or an official of any government, to favor, adopt, or oppose, by vote or otherwise, any legislation, law, ratification, policy, or appropriation, whether before or after the introduction of any bill, measure, or resolution proposing such legislation, law, ratification, policy, or appropriation.
- 3) Expenditure of the funds allocated herein is contingent on the continued appropriation and availability of LATCF funds for this purpose.

Resolution #5304 -11

Whereas, the Cleburne County Commission has a 2010 Ford Explorer, that is used by County employees for traveling for training, etc.;

Whereas, the vehicle needs the hood and top repainted;

Whereas, the service will cost \$1500;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission agrees to spend \$1500 to repaint a portion of the vehicle.

Resolution #5304-12

Whereas, the Cleburne County Human Resource Officer has provided an estimate on the cost of potential increases in salaries, based on the pay study previously performed;

Whereas, the possible increase for employees would be performance based and would result in a "step up" within each employee pay grade;

Whereas, the Cleburne County Commission, expresses interest in the cost of this and other possible options;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission agrees to task the Human Resource Officer with gathering more information on options available for the possibility of later consideration.

Resolution #5304-13

Whereas, the citizens of Cleburne County have voted to support "The Alabama Limited Self-Governance Act";

Whereas, the referendum allows for certain types of nuisance abatement ordinances;

Whereas, the County Attorney has previously provided general information for the drafting of such ordinances;

Therefore, the Cleburne County Commission agrees to task the County Attorney with proceeding with the steps needed, to start the process of creating a nuisance abatement ordinance.

Resolution #5309

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CLEBURNE COUNTY TO JOIN THE STATE OF ALABAMA AND OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS PARTICIPANTS IN CURRENT AND FUTURE OPIOID SETTLEMENTS

WHEREAS, the opioid epidemic continues to impact communities in the United States,

the State of Alabama, and Cleburne County, Alabama.

WHEREAS, Cleburne County has suffered harm and will continue to suffer harm as a result of the opioid epidemic;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama and some Alabama local governments have filed lawsuits against opioid manufacturers, distributors, and retailers ("Opioid Litigation");

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has entered into various Settlement Agreements and are likely to enter into additional agreements in the future which include the claims for the State of Alabama's local governments;

WHEREAS Cleburne County finds the terms of the current Settlement Agreements acceptable and in the best interest of the community and anticipates the terms of the future Settlement Agreements to be similarly acceptable;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has prepared and presented Settlement Sign-On Agreements to the local governments and Cleburne County finds the terms of the Sign-On Agreement acceptable and in the best interest of the community;

WHEREAS, the current and future Settlement Agreements and Sign-On Agreements will detail the allocation of Settlement Funds, which Cleburne County finds acceptable and in the best interest of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CLEBURNE COUNTY COMMISSION:

Section 1. That Cleburne County finds that participation in the various Opioid Settlements, Settlement Agreement and Sign-On Agreement is in the best interest of Cleburne County and its citizens because such a plan would ensure an effective structure for the commitment of Settlement Funds to abate and seek to resolve the opioid epidemic.

Section 2. That Cleburne County hereby expresses its support for the Settlement of various Opioid claims and allocation and use of Settlement Funds as generally described in the Settlement Agreement and Sign-On Agreement.

Section 3. That the Cleburne County Commission Chairman ("Chairman") is hereby expressly authorized to execute the Settlement Sign-On Agreements and is hereby authorized to execute any formal agreements necessary to implement the Settlements and plan for the allocation and use of Settlement Funds.

Section 4. That the Chairman is hereby expressly authorized to execute any formal agreement and related documents evidencing Cleburne County's agreement to the settlement of claims and litigation related to the Opioid Epidemic.

Section 5. That the Chairman is authorized to take such other action as necessary and appropriate to effectuate Cleburne County's participation in any Settlement related to the Opioid Epidemic.

Section 6. This Resolution is effective upon adoption, the welfare of Cleburne County, Alabama requiring it.

Reports from staff:

- A. County Administrator, Lisa Copeland, informs the Commission that the Sheriff Department Maintenance bid advertisement was published in the newspapers today, it will be held on Friday, February 24th. As of now, there have not been any bids turned in. She informs the Commission we have received two opioid checks from Jansen. She also informs the Commission the Jail Loan will be paid off on June 1, 2024.
- B. County Engineer, Lee Estes is absent
- C. County Attorney, Jason Odom, did not have any updates

Old Business:

There is no Old Business to attend to this meeting.

Discussion Items:

Commissioner Terry Hendrix discusses with the Commission about who is responsible for the Cleburne County Watershed Dams. He states he has spoken with Vernon Abney from the USDA who says it is our responsibility, however he will not put that in writing nor will he meet for a discussion if our County attorney is present. The Commission tasks the County Administrator, Lisa Copeland, to gather information on the watersheds and draft a letter with the help of the County Attorney, Jason Odom.

Chairman, Ryan Robertson informs the Commission that the Probate Office will be closed March 16th and March 17th for the installation of the drop ceiling. He also states his Chief Clerk, April Brown will be retiring. A retirement party for her will be held on the JSU side of the Mountain Center on April 16th at 3:00 PM. Lori Jarrell will replace her as Chief Clerk. Kayla Thompson will be the new Recording Clerk. The Probate Office has advertised for a Tag Clerk position.
